Home will be on the left.



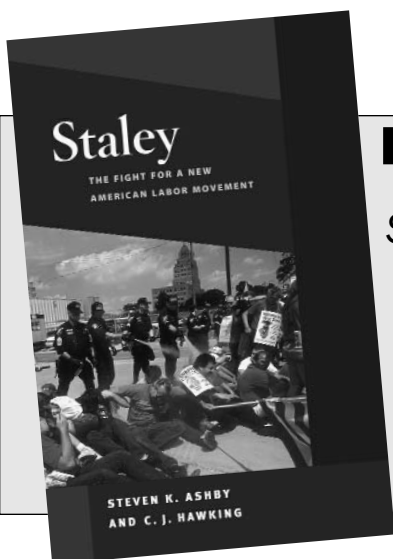
