Jorge Parra is among 68 former GM workers in Colombia who were dismissed from their jobs after suffering work-related injuries. Their group has camped out in front of the U.S. Embassy in Bogota for over 400 days, asking for medical care and new work assignments. He and many others are currently on a hunger strike. He has come to Detroit to bring his message to GM Headquarters here, and alert the US public to the actions of a corporation that US taxpayers bailed out recently.
